



Brainstorm with your peers and WRITE ON THE BOARDS as many formats and media modes you can think of where a scholar might share their work with others.








Purpose



General Public (Elevator Speech)


Write 3-4 sentences that explain:


- What you are doing

- ✓ Tell a story and the big picture

Interdisciplinary Scholars (Abstract)


Write 5-7 sentences that include:

- The topic of your work
- Your research question or aim
- Summary of your methods or process
- Anticipated outcomes
- Significance of your work
- Translate disciplinary jargon
- Clarify with purpose
- Consider disciplinary connections

Audience #3

Disciplinary Experts (Media, Networking)

Write several sentences that include:

- Framework & significance of your work
- Specific question, aim, or problem driving your work
- Details of your methods or process, including analysis of any data
- √ Focus on what is new or controversial
- Explain the scholarly gap your work fills
- Highlight implications and applications
